BECKY HIGBEE, MD

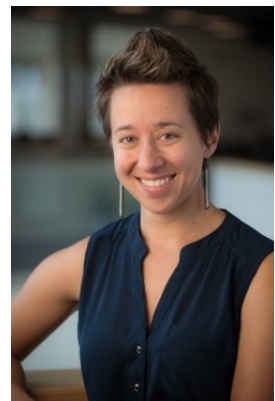
